TOO GOOD TO BE TRUE?

An enterprising undertaker heard that a local cemetery had been closed and was being cleared of memorials so that the site could be developed. He hurried to the scene, loaded a van with some headstones and immediately placed an ad in the local paper:

SECOND HAND GRAVESTONES JUST IN

- BARGAIN FOR FAMILY NAMED SMITH!

If that sounds too good to be true there was the genuine story of a municipal cemetery a few years ago facing the challenge of maintenance of some large Victorian monuments and forced to consider dismantling them. There were legal procedures to follow before this could be done and with no hint of irony a spokesman lamented:

'It can prove quite difficult locating the original owners of some of these graves.'

Does Easter sound too good to be true? We shouldn't think of the Resurrection in narrow terms of a consolation prize with the catch being that you have to be dead. It is possible of course to be living yet somehow not fully alive, to be blessedly healthy and rich yet be in the grip of an experience that is death. Resurrection is for here and now, known to those who joyfully, riskily embrace dying to selfishness.

We struggle to find the words to describe the experience. That effort has been mirrored in the Lenten discipline of Six Word Sermons. Some who were afraid of what this might entail found they were enriched by taking part in the exercise and we all benefited from the contributions of others. As you read this, Lent will be giving way to the journey of Holy Week, the highs and lows and the joy of Easter. Between them, the Gospel writers suggest Jesus gave not six but seven short sermons or 'words' from the Cross. Perfection, resolution, completion; these are all suggested by the number seven. The annual journey of HolyWeek is at the heart of the faith lived by Christians and whether established or newcomer we look forward to seeing as many of you as possible.

Colgate Parish Council Newsletter March 2014

Annual Meeting

On 10th March the Parish Council held its Annual Meeting where the Clerk gave a brief review on the year 2013/14. A copy of the report can be found on Community21.

Council Meeting

This was also held on 10th March. The main points on the agenda were speed and the Neighbourhood Plan. Councillors will be seeking the opinion of residents along Forest Road in an attempt to understand the resident's views on the speeding issue.

In respect of the Neighbourhood Plan, the Councillors would be pleased to hear from any residents who would be interested in helping develop a Neighbourhood Plan in partnership with the council. If you would, please contact the Clerk on colgateclerk@hotmail.co.uk

The Council will organise a meeting for residents to help understand what a Neighbourhood Plan is. A date for this will be publicised nearer the time. More information on Neighbourhood Plans can be found on Horsham District Council's website.

It was noted that new dog fouling signs had been erected opposite the school to encourage dog owners to remove their dog's mess.

The hedge had been replaced at Colgate Village Hall.

Faygate Village Hall has applied for a grant to redecorate the Village Hall in Faygate. Colgate Parish Council supported this application and advised Horsham District Council accordingly.



Gardener's Journal

Two or three weeks of warm dry weather followed months of rain. It has been mild and early blossoms have not suffered the usual, teasing late frosts – so far. Pink cherries and camellias are flowering freely and the first of the rhododendrons, Christmas Cheer, has been in blossom since January. Others are following. Pieris White Pearl is a particularly fine sight this year. Primroses, forsythia, camellias and daffodils have been looking terrific in both our villages. Lawns have received their first mowing and paths wend through the daffodils and bluebells. Flowerbeds have received their winter clean-up and a bolstering of leaf compost and a little fertiliser. A head start on weeding now will save much trouble in summer. Be ready to discourage moles, spot weedkill to catch dandelions at an early stage and feed as desired. Dahlias are coming up in the greenhouse. All fruits should have been pruned by now, but they will survive late attention. In the vegetable garden some of last year's crops – parsnips and swiss chard - are still coming in, while purple sprouting broccoli planted experimentally in containers are harvesting nicely. As beds are emptied manure and/or compost should be added in preparation for the coming season. Rotate crops from year to year and pay heed to the merits of companion planting as a natural check on pests. Onion sets and garlic are starting to grow. Peas and potatoes should be in the ground or try them in containers. Rhubarb is ready for a first picking. Broad beans from the greenhouse can be put in their seasonal location and supplemented by direct sowings. Containers generating their own micro-climates can be sown with carrots, beet, spinach, parsnips and so on. In the greenhouse lengths of guttering have been used for sowings of parsnips, leeks and lettuce. Tomatoes are coming up. At the end of the month runner and pole beans can be started in the greenhouse.

The equinox has passed and the gardener's chores are multiplying. Look out for pests such as small rabbits that wriggle under the fence. Keep the bird tables well stocked. The rising dawn chorus heralds support for dealing with unwanted bugs and slugs. By the front door the nesting box is in active occupation by a pair of blue tits. And listen out for the first cuckoo.

A REMINDER TO DOG WALKERS

Dogs: you may take your dog with you on a public right of way, provided that it is kept on a lead or is otherwise effectively controlled, remains on the path and does not worry livestock.

The law requires dog owners to keep their dogs under close control [which means walking at heel or on a short (2 metre) lead] when on a public right of way. Dogs should not be allowed to run loose in fields crossed by public rights of way or to roam off the path on extending leads. Don't allow your dog to run through arable crops or to flush out game from hedgerows or scrub. Such actions will not be appreciated by the landowner, and can easily harm wildlife, especially nesting birds.

If there is a problem with dog fouling you will need to contact your local District Council who are responsible for the removal of dog excrement.

It is an offence under the Dogs (Protection of Livestock) Act 1953 to allow a dog to attack or chase livestock. Dogs must be kept 'on a lead or otherwise under close control'. A landowner can also shoot or injure a dog that is apparently out of control and worrying sheep or other livestock, and the dog's owner will not be compensated.

When cutting your hedges this spring/summer please be aware that you could be committing an offence if you were to damage or destroy a birds nest.

Under Section 1 of the Wildlife and Countryside Act 1981 (as amended), wild birds are protected from being killed, injured or captured, while their nests and eggs are protected from being damaged, destroyed or taken. In addition, certain species such as the barn owl are included in Schedule 1 of the Act and are protected against disturbance while nesting and when they have dependent young. Offences against birds listed on Schedule 1 of the Wildlife and Countryside Act (as amended) are subject to special penalties.




Homage to the Volunteer by Mike Russell of the Sussex Wildlife Trust

A much anticipated package arrived at Woods Mill for me the other week, something I have been eagerly anticipating since 2007 in fact. It was a book; *The Birds of Sussex* produced by the Sussex Ornithological Society (SOS) and is the result of four years surveying birds in Sussex. The surveying was carried out by hundreds of volunteers in the County, and I'm very proud to say that I made my own tiny contribution to this fabulous and informative book.

In fact, this mighty tome is just part of the UK Bird Atlas 2007-2011 a complete survey of the birds of this country and Ireland organised by the British Trust for Ornithology (BTO). This four year survey involved collating, interpreting and then producing a definitive Atlas for the birds of the UK at the present time. A staggering one hundred million plus individual records were submitted from over 40,000 volunteers to provide such a complete picture of our avifauna.

So this article pays homage to the wonderful contribution that volunteers play in the conservation of wildlife in Britain, not just with this project but right across the environmental movement. It is this volunteer involvement that underpins the whole of conservation in the UK and really sets us apart from most other countries in the world when it comes to the preservation of our wildlife. All the major conservation organisations in Britain began as volunteer groups and while they have all grown enormously during their lifetime, volunteering is still fundamental to all of them. There is now also a strong professional conservation input but this enables even more voluntary effort to be co-ordinated in the fight to conserve our



precious wildlife. The Sussex Wildlife Trust is still very much a partnership of professional staff and volunteers with over 500 volunteers contributing to the work that we do throughout Sussex.


Back to the *Birds of Sussex* and the SOS. This is an entirely volunteer based project and publication, from the hundreds of people going out and surveying their 'patch' and then submitting their individual records, to the people inputting that data, interpreting its meanings, comparing it with information from previous surveys and then producing the maps and text to provide a very informative and meaningful summary of each species recorded in Sussex. In addition, there are also chapters on habitat and landscape, climate change, migration and ringing records and conservation of birds throughout the County. The book has been co-ordinated by a dedicated band of SOS members, and then drawn together superbly by the editor, Adrian Thomas.

It is a book with a much wider appeal than just to birdwatchers. The individual style of the authors and the clear presentation of the information make it very readable, though it is one to dip into rather than read from cover to cover. Just before the book goes into the summary for each individual species, there is a chapter highlighting the winners and losers regarding birds in the county. Not surprisingly, the science confirms the declining species that many of us were aware of, tree sparrow, lesser spotted woodpecker, turtle dove and willow tit that looks to be extinct in Sussex now. To balance things out though, we have gained little egret, marsh harrier, siskin and Mediterranean gull in the last 30 years.


