Dear Sharon,

In answering your query it is worth pointing out that it is the Core Strategy that sets the allocation for the various towns and villages. The SHLAA is just one piece of evidence that has been used to inform this figure.

The wording of the Core Strategy is that the 30 units need to be delivered through allocations. As you will know, the land subject to the application submitted by Gleesons is not an allocation and is being pursued primarily on the basis of the District Council not having a sufficient housing land supply. Hence, if the application was granted consent, the Core Strategy, as currently worded, would still require 30 units to be allocated in either the Neighbourhood Plan, or the Council's site allocations document.

I hope that this answers your query.
