# Gardner's Journal.....

Mid holiday time & the garden is much changed from a month ago. Finished are the rhododendrons & azaleas. The lawns are now fully mown & even the colourful foxgloves are finished. Woods & shrubs serve as a background of varying green to brightly hued borders & planters. Dahlias, hydrangeas & agapanthus are among the dramatic summer flowers that now steal the show & lighten the long summer days.

Keep planters regularly feed with liquid fertilizer, & water even if there has been rain. Meanwhile this is the time to cut back spring shrubs & keep the paths of a woodland garden clear & well defined. Keep new shrubs & perennials well watered if summer rains fall short. With the warmer weather have come the weeds & weeding is a daily chore.



In the vegetable garden sweet peas are at their best while pole beans & runner



beans are about to burst into production. New beetroot are coming in & leeks are beginning their summer growth. Pumpkins & summer squash are showing their fruit. Onions will be harvested in three weeks & potatoes are ready for digging. Tomatoes & summer squash have been planted up in the greenhouse. They are carrying plenty of immature fruit. Keep them well watered & nourished with regular liquid fertilizer.

Even though conditions have been dry slugs & snails are much in evidence. There is no substitute for vigilance & regular late evening slug patrols are productive. Feathered

friends can help & a few peanut feeders will attract them to the garden. Woodpeckers can be particularly entertaining. The rabbit is perhaps a worse problem!

A recent visit to the Cotswolds for a wedding showed a

very different, gentler landscape. No rhododendrons or azaleas were to be seen but flourishing roses & orchards, & stone walls lifted the eye from village to village across the valleys.

### From the Rev. Nick Flint

Like many, I was delighted to hear that Bishop Mark's spiritual journey has recently brought him to recognize the ministry of female bishops, priests and deacons alongside their male colleagues. This change of heart for a public figure is a courageous step. Following the season of ordinations Bishop Mark's reflections below resonate powerfully with me as I recall an elderly lady, a complete stranger, telling me, when I was in my late teens 'I can see in your face that you are going to be a priest!'. Such an affirmation, alongside that of others was the kind of significant encouragement echoed in what Bishop Mark' has to say this month, fresh from the season of ordinations:

EVERY SAMUEL NEEDS AN ELI

Parishes look forward to the arrival of deacons who come with fresh ideas and enthusiasm as well as their individual gifts and they generally offer their new curates a very warm welcome.

The new deacons, of course, are naturally excited to begin a ministry for which they have spent two or three years preparing either at theological college or through one of the residential courses, but this is bound to be mixed with a few nerves about the responsibility they are undertaking.

That there *are* any deacons to ordain each year is dependent upon the church calling people into its service.

We are an 'apostolic' church, that is to say a church which has 'sending people out' in its DNA. Jesus called people to follow him and then made 'apostles' of them by sending them out in the service of others.

It is members of the Church who observe and discern in one another those gifts which are necessary in ordained ministry and so it is members of the Church - you and me - who must help people understand that God may be calling them to ordained ministry.

Sometimes it may be in quite young people that we discern a potential ordinand, but it is often an older and more mature Christian that is able to point out what God is doing; think of the call of Samuel in the Bible book of the same name.

Perhaps you are that older mature Christian. Every Samuel needs an Eli.

At the last meeting the speeding issue along Forest Road was discussed & councillors are keen to progress traffic calming. With the recent restructure at WSCC all requests have to be referred to the Highways Department. The Clerk has written to Highways in this regard & awaits a reply. Mention was also made about HGV's using Park Road as a cut through & the destruction of the kerbs brought about by the vehicles. The Clerk has also asked Highways about weight and/or width restriction along Park Road.

# **Summer Crime Prevention**

Keep cool - Although the number of burglaries across Sussex is falling, there is always a rise during the summer because of insecure doors & windows.

### Stay secure - Don't make it easy for burglars.

Summer is a time of warm days when windows, doors & garages are often left open, & tools & valuables may be left lying around outside.

The most common causes of opportunist summer burglary involve offenders that: -

- Enter an insecure front door while residents are in the back garden.
- Enter doors that are closed but unlocked at night while residents are asleep.
- Reach through windows to take valuable items.

#### Summer burglary prevention tips

- If you are out in the back garden, ensure that your front door is secure.
- Put your garden tools & games away into a secure garage or tool shed after using them, they could be used to break into your home, or your neighbours.
- When you leave a room unattended, close the windows & doors especially on the ground floor.
- If you want to leave windows open while you sleep, fit window restrictors so they cannot be fully opened, or make sure they are not large enough to allow access to a burglar.
- Keep all wallets, purses, credit cards, car keys & other valuables out of sight.
- Consider fitting outside security lighting or a visible alarm to help deter burglars. Even using pea shingle or gravel on a driveway & spiky plants in garden beds can help.
- If you park your car out in the countryside, take your bag or wallet with you & don't leave other belongings on view in your car. Even an old coat left in sight could tempt someone to break in.

# Wildlife at the Heart of our Culture By Mike Russell of the Sussex Wildlife Trust

Birdsong seems to be all over the place these days. 'Tweet of the Day' in the morning on Radio 4 has generated a great

following amongst the early risers, while a recent television programme of BBC 4, part of the a 'Slow Season' series, showing the dawn chorus without any commentary of intrusive music was deemed a popular success. Contemporary folk singer Sam Lee has this summer organized live performances alongside nightingales, following on from the famous live broadcasts of the 1920s & 1930s of Beatrice Harrison accompanying a probably somewhat perplexed nightingale on her cello in a Surrey woodland.

I went to a very interesting art installation as part of the Brighton Festival this year. Composer Marcus Coates had recorded the song of a number of common bird species & slowed the



speed right down to individual notes & then got human singers to sing those notes while videoing them. He then speeded up the notes to the original song of the birds, resulting in some remarkable footage of the humans not only sounding like the birds but also moving a bit like them as well. In fact, nature was the underlying theme of the whole Brighton Festival programme.

There is no doubt that wildlife has been such an inspiration for musicians, artists, authors & poets as far back as when man started drawing what they saw around them in their caves & a resurgence of interest in this is very evident today. Just think how poor our cultural heritage would be without all the nature that surrounds us in our daily lives, but that is what faces artists in the future as much of our wildlife is in serious decline.

To take just one example, the nightingale. Nightingales have declined by 43% in the last 40 years & there is evidence that the decline is showing. We still do quite well in Sussex but the clear evidence is that their population is shrinking into the southeast corner of England. When John Keats



was inspired to write 'Ode to a Nightingale' he was listening to the nightingales on Hampstead Heath, but it's a long time since any sang there. Thomas Hardy would be hard pushed to hear one in Wessex now. An even worse scenario awaits the turtle dove, as their decline has plummeted by 90% in the same time period & is in serious danger of becoming extinct in the UK within a decade if this decline continues.

So, the need to link that inspiration & conservation of the landscape & species needs to be made much more apparent. Every artist who has been inspired by the natural world, every person who has enjoyed the result of that artist's inspiration should stand up & rally against those who have so much disregard for our natural world.

Wildlife is essential to life, the natural world provides everything we need to exist, but it also provides for our soul. I hope those in the future will still be able to have their soul nourished by the song of the nightingale.
