The Rector's Reflections

The Church's Annual Meeting took place at the end of April, & it was an opportunity to reflect & look forward.

Challenge & change are facts of life, & in the life of a Church there are occasions when they are brought into sharp relief. Such has certainly been the case during the last 12 months.

We have three special meetings with Archdeacon Fiona & a visit from Bishop Mark in which we have contributed to & reflected on a strategic review which aimed to identify challenges & deliver the change needed to meet them. For the united benefice of Rusper & Colgate the specific challenges have been the approach to Kilnwood Vale & the cumulative effect of the differences & demands of the two parishes during the last 20 years. I hope I will be forgiven for singling out by name John Stoddart for the unique contribution he has made to the ministry until recently & Peter Murray who has to some extent stepped into his shoes. Again, until last year when we were very grateful to Kay for stepping in I feel I also want to thanks Rosemary Lane by name, as uniquely she has held the same post of PCC secretary, a constant & calm point of reference over all those changes, comings & goings. Sarah-Jo Davies has served two terms as Deanery Synod & is also stepping down with our thanks.

Through the year of flagship project of Cuppa & Chat has continued to thrive & I am encouraged that its success has let to us reviving the idea of reordering the church building for greater welcome & growth.

It is good for St. Saviour's to being looking forward, not back. This church has not experienced a vacancy since 1973. The vast majority of churches face them every few years, sometimes repeatedly & often at best they provide a creative space & time to take stock. It is my prayer that this betwixt & between period may prove such a time. Eastertide is the great season of hope & should encourage us to look forward. Ascension tide should lead us to look up & beyond, to stand on our own feet. The cycle is complete with Pentecost & the promise of the Spirit to enable us in all we have to do for God. No doubt it will have its own ups & downs but I am sure an exciting chapter lies ahead for St. Saviour's & All Saints.

I hope this finds you all very well & enjoying the warmer weather (we had some lovely days in May!).

I have been busy getting on with Village Agent work, working my way around Rusper, Colgate & Faygate, getting to know more about your villages & meeting some of you villagers on the way.

Village Agent contact cards have been placed in Rusper Village store along with the new season Arun magazine. Posters have been put up in the villages (new noticeboard in Colgate) showing the very tasty Monthly Sunday Roast at Lavinia House Club & Electric Blanket testing scheduled for October 2016, bookings being taken now. Arun magazines placed in St. Saviour's. I met with villagers at Rusper & Colgate Cuppa & Chat groups, always made to feel very welcome at these happy social meetings.

As I have been getting around & meeting some of you, I have been asking the question 'Would non drivers be interested in a new weekly mini bus transport service running once a week at the beginning of the week?'. 

Colgate Weather - February to April 2016

February started mild & unsettled with strong south-westerly winds & storm Henry, although we missed the heavy rain that fell in the west, in fact it remained dry

until the evening of the 5th. It was relatively warm too, as the temperature was above 50F (10C) until the 7th when there was heavy rain giving 0.32" & 0.45" the following day, this being the heaviest of the month, whilst it was a little colder at 45F. The strong winds of the 7th & 8th were due to storm Imogen & it appeared that the weather forecasters were rapidly going through the alphabet with their new system of naming storms! Most days were cloudy & the first sunny day was the 11th & it was frosty for the first time in the month but the next 2 days were dull & drizzly with the temperature dipping to 39F. From the 15th there was a



with the temperature dipping to 39F. From the 15th there was a settled & dry colder spell, with sharp frosts & more sunshine before more rain on the 18th gave us 0.34", but the weekend of the 20th-21st was mild with further light rain & gusty winds & a temperature of 54F. Thereafter the rest of the month was generally dry, sunny & cool at 45F, with overnight frosts & sunny or bright days. Total rainfall was 2.02", just below average in what is usually one of the drier months of the year & it was mild too. Winter is now statistically over & it would have been the mildest on record if the temperature had not sunk a little in the second half of February, so it was a little milder in 20047 & 1989.

March began with low pressure in charge & 0.17" of rain on the 1st, although it was warm at 52F, before the wind swung round to a north-westerly direction & it became much colder with sleet & hail on the 2nd. However, there were some sunny



periods between the showers & we missed the storms from Storm Jake which hit the south-west. The second week of the month brought several frosts & further hail & rain, especially on the 8th, when 0.85" fell, before it became milder on the 11th, after a further frost, with a sunny day at 52F. The 12th saw a dense fog, the first for quite a while, but the sun eventually broke through & this pattern was repeated the next day & there was a 4 day break in the rain before a small amount fell on the 15th. However, high pressure became established over Scandinavia & this blocked the wetter westerly winds so we had

a north-easterly airflow over us right through the 3rd week of March & an 8 day dry spell with some spells of sunshine & it was warmer between 52-55F. This sequence broke down on the 24th with 0.46" of rain & then 0.48" on the 26th, but it was a lovely day on the 25th & warm at 59F so it was a good Good Friday! The rest of the Easter weekend was another story as Storm Katie swept in with some of the strongest winds we have experienced for many years & giving us 0.94" of rain over Easter Sunday (27th) with the worst of the winds the next day. There was further rain for the following few days but the 31st was sunny all day ending the month on a bright note. The month was a little colder than average & the sunshine total was average but the rainfall at 3.85" was way above what we usually have, in fact it was the 3rd highest in 25 years, making it difficult for those of us who like walking in the countryside instead of on tarmac!

April started with a slight frost but a dry, sunny day followed, although this was to be one of only three dry days in the first half of the month. Heavy rain on the second produced 0.17" & the following week saw us having frequent April showers as westerly winds held away but it was mild at 50-55F. It turned warmer on the 12th with

a couple of sunny days & a temperature of 63F but inevitably for Spring it all broke down on the 15th with showers & then heavy prolonged rain giving 0.58", the highest of the month. The following day was showery & much colder at 46F & this was followed by a severe frost on the 17th but at least it was dry & it remained dry for the next week. The wind became more northerly or easterly & there were several sunny days although not particularly warm ones, fluctuating from 59F to 48F. Once more it was all change on the 23rd (St. George's Day) with north-easterly breezes in charge so that the final week of the



month was unsettled with small amounts of rain in the form of showers every day, however a coupled of last frosty mornings were also in evidence, catching out the unwary gardeners. The 30th was bright, breezy & showery & that summed up the month. The rainfall at 2.13" was about average, although twice last year's low, & sunshine levels were also unremarkable, whilst the temperature mainly stuck in the low 50'sF.



Summer Burglaries

Stay Secure

Don't make it easy for burglars



A burglary in your own home is a devastating experience that can affect you & your family long after the incident has occurred. The good news is that the risk of becoming a victim of burglary in Sussex is low & since launching Sussex Police's initiative to tackle burglary under the banner of Operation Magpie in 2012, there has been a year on year reduction in burglary dwellings across Sussex.

Keep cool - Although the number of burglaries across Sussex is falling, there is always a rise during the summer because of insecure doors & windows.

Summer is the time of warm days when windows, doors & garages are often left open, & tools & valuables may be left lying around outside. The most common cases of opportunist summer burglary involve offenders that: -

- Enter an insecure front door while residents are in the back garden.
- Enter doors that are closed but unlocked at night while residents are asleep.
- Reach through windows to take valuable items.

Summer burglary prevention tips: -

- If you are out in the back garden, ensure that your front door is secure.
- Put your garden tools & games away into a secure garage or tools shed after using them, they could be used to break into your home, or your neighbours.
- When you leave a room unattended, close the windows & doors especially on the ground floor.
- If you want to leave windows open while you sleep, fit window restrictors so they cannot be fully opened, or make sure they are not large enough to allow access to a burglar.
- Keep all wallets, purses, credit cards, car keys & other valuables out of sight.
- Consider fitting outside security lighting or a visible alarm to help deter burglars. Even using pea shingle or gravel on a driveway & spiky plants in garden beds can help.
- If you park your car out in the countryside, take your bag or wallet with you & don't leave other belongings on view in your car. Even on old coat left in sight could tempt someone to break in.
- Make it a habit to mark your valuables by using your postcode & house number or name.
- Some articles are unsuitable for marking so photograph them.
- Register your property at immobilize.com, its free of charge & can increase your chances of being reunited with your property.

Burglars know the price of everything but the value of nothing. The best defense against burglary is prevention.

Gardener's Journal

A burst of warm weather at the start of May ended this year's unusually prolonged & prolific season of spring bulbs - daffodils, tulips & bluebells. Rhododendrons & azaleas have come into their own & the wisteria has been magnificent. So summer approaches, & roses are already showing signs of a brilliant June. Mowing is up to once every two weeks already but be careful to allow fading daffodils & other bulbs to restore themselves uncut until near the end of June. Keep adding compost & manure to flower beds & sprinkle with fertilizer. Pruning of spring flowerers such as forsythia can be undertaken. In the vegetable garden potatoes are doing well & broad beans & root crops will hopefully escape the slugs. Add mulch to strawberries & raspberries, & try to curb the latters' tendency to sprout everywhere. In the greenhouse tomatoes have been staked & butternut squash are beginning to climb, as will the cucumber. Greenhouse vegetables such as tomatoes will need regular feeding, weekly if possible, to do really well. Courgettes will be grown in old rain barrels

outside.

Terrace planters blossomed with white & pink tulips. Now these should be replaced, perhaps with geraniums, lobelia, fuchsias' daisies & other summer favourites, or the occasional shrub or young tree, capable of transplant to the garden at the end of the season. Again, these planters will need weekly feeding to produce their best.

Outside the fence the woods are full of deer this year, following a mild winter. The birdfeeders remain active with cock pheasants resplendent in their spring plumage, & the nesting boxes have been busy. The dawn choruses continue. But has the first cuckoo been heard?



USSEX A New Voice Graces the Sussex Countryside ildlife Trust By Mike Russell of the Sussex Wildlife Trust

A new voice has been added to the Sussex avian chorus over the last few years, emanating from a shy, difficult to see little brown bird whose explosive song belies its reticent nature. Cetti's Warbler, first recorded in the UK in Kent in 1961 can now be heard all over our county.



Named after an 18th Century Jesuit naturalist Francesco Cetti, this little bird has marched relentlessly north-westerly across Europe, expanding its range from the core of the population in South-east Europe, North Africa & parts of Asia. Having hopped over the English Channel in 1961, it was ten years later before breeding was proven to have taken place, all the time they were spreading westward along the south coast, in the early 1970s they suddenly disappeared from the south-east due to some pretty cold winters, but in the 1980s their numbers began to recover & due to our winters becoming warmer, it was enough to establish a viable breeding population. Now, they have become a good news wildlife story, increasing numbers & continuing to expand their range northwards & westwards.

Their arrival in the UK coincided with another species that initially colonised in south-east England, the little egret, but whereas this striking white water bird is very visible & easy to see, the Cetti's Warbler isn't. To describe what it looks like, it might be best to say it looks like an over-sized wren in that it is basically brown & often sits with its tail cocked upwards, but you have to be lucky to actually see it at all. They like to live in damp places, close to water that has dense low vegetation in which they can skulk away to their hearts content.

It's the song that is most striking about the Cetti's Warbler. An almost machine-gun like burst that just lasts for a couple of seconds & then you don't hear it again, which is most frustrating as you search the vegetation with your eyes in a vain attempt to try & see it. About five minutes later it will belt out the call again from somewhere else. It is the male that does all the singing, & it moves about its territory belting out the song to try & convince other males that there is more than one bird there & thereby reducing competition for territory & females.

Twentieth Century bird photographer & author George Yeates tried somewhat unsuccessfully to describe the bird's song in words:

What yer.....What yer.....What yer.....come-and-see-me.....bet-you-don't-bet-you-don't

I think that probably leaves you none the wiser as to what a Cetti's Warbler sounds like, but it does show how difficult it is to describe bird song in general to people who have no idea of what you are talking about! So, the best thing to remember that if you are standing near water surrounded by dense vegetation & you suddenly hear a short but loud outburst of song from deep within, you may well have just heard your first Cetti's Warbler, & I'm sure Signore Francesco Cetti would have been very pleased.


