#### Wiston Parish Community-Led Plan 2013 Produced by Parish Council with the support of local residents

#### **Background and Process**

Councillors commenced the process in the autumn of 2012, inviting a representative of Action in rural Sussex to attend the Harvest Supper in Wiston Village Hall.

Following a survey, residents had highlighted issues that were of concern and were able to discuss these with Councillors and AirS, indicating which issues should take priority.



#### **About Wiston**

**Wiston** is a small village in the shadow of the Downs, overseen by the historic Wiston Estate and Chanctonbury Ring. It is a civil parish in the Horsham District and lies on the A283 road 2.8 miles northwest of Steyning. The parish covers an area of 1,360 hectares (3,400 acres). In the 2011 census 219 people lived in 89 households. 164 residents fall within the age group 16-74 of which 142 are economically active.

**Wiston House:** Wiston House, an Elizabethan mansion much altered in the Victorian era, is owned by the Goring family. At present it is let to the Foreign Office as a conference centre, known as Wilton Park.

Adjacent to Wiston House sits St Mary's Church, which had reached such a poor condition by Victorian times that it had to be almost completely rebuilt in 1862. The church has some interesting historic fragments.

**Buncton Manor Farmhouse** is a 15th Century, partly moated farmhouse, surrounded by fields on a working farm. Situated on the route of the Sussex Greensand Way, a Roman footpath between the Adur floodplain and Hardham

**All Saint's Chapel, Buncton:** – This tiny church, almost 1000 years old, is approached by a steep path through a wood above Water Lane. It was built by the Monks of Sele Priory in Upper Beeding as a preaching station. Various materials were used in its construction, from pieces of Roman tile to carved stone arches decorated with small fruits. Inside there are traces of medieval wall paintings. Services are held at Buncton on the third Sunday of the month

- To work with our local PCSO and Sussex Police Authority to reduce the number of large and speeding vehicles through the village.
- To work with WSCC School Transport to ask school coaches not to use Wiston village as a cut through.
- To work with WSCC Highways and our local County Councillor to introduce measures that would make residents and pedestrians feel safer.
- To investigate local minibus schemes / lift share options.

- Ensure that WSCC and Estate keep ditches, drains, culverts and gullies clear in the future.
- Support residents at risk of being flooded.
- Identify housing need and investigate options

#### **Action Plan**

- Support the Village Shop as the 'hub' of the village.

- Introduce a 'buddy' scheme to allow older residents to call upon the help of other residents.
