Wanted Graham Court may be in Horsham or Worthing

Graham Court, 52, is wanted on recall to prison and it is believed that he may be in the Horsham or Worthing areas.

He is white, 6', of skinny build, with brown, slightly greying hair with a distinctive widow's peak.

He is wanted having failed to adhere to the terms of his licence following his release from prison in March, where he was serving a six month sentence for theft and possessing a knife blade in a public place. Both offences occurred in Horsham.

Man interviewed over non-recent sex offences in Warnham

On Tuesday (4 April) a 77-year old man living in Shrewsbury was interviewed under caution, by appointment at Shrewsbury police station, by Sussex officers investigating a report received in October 2016 that in the late 1970's and early 1980's a then 10 to 11-year old girl was sexually assaulted at two locations in Warnham, one of which was Warnham parish church.

He was not arrested and the investigation continues.

As some of the alleged offending relates to Warnham parish church, Sussex Police are working closely with the Diocese of Chichester's Safeguarding Team, who are actively supporting this investigation. Officers emphasise that there are no current safeguarding issues for the church or the local Warnham community in relation to the investigation. Detective Superintendent Jason Tingley said; "If you have any information that would assist our investigation, including information about any other offences, please contact us via 101@sussex.pnn.police.uk or call Sussex 101, quoting Operation Adwell, and arrange to talk in confidence to experienced investigators."
